PSLE Posting Exercise

After PSLE results are released, students are given the PSLE certificates and an option form to apply for the schools that they qualify for.

After 3-4 weeks, the posting results are released, and students learn about which school they will go to. Under DSA, students apply to join a secondary school before PSLE. After the application, students will have to undergo an interview or more (June Holidays to Term 3), to be selected to join the secondary school.

Upon successful application, students will be offered a chance to join the secondary school (partially based on PSLE results).

What is DSA-Sec?

DSA-Sec seeks to broaden the recognition of talents and achievements beyond academic grades. P6 students can gain direct entry to certain secondary schools based on their talent in sports, CCAs and specific academic areas, etc, before taking the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE).

P6 students can apply for DSA-Sec based on a wide-range of talents, including:


- Sports and games

- Face-to-face
- First Impressions (Appearance)

Interview Etiquette - Appearance • First Impressions Count

Eye

- No coloured contact lenses

Face

- Beards and moustaches are not allowed
- Sideburns should not extend below the middle of the ear

Sleeve - Should not be rolled up

- Should not be rolled up

Hand - No jewellery or bands

Pants

- No belt loops on the waist band
 No belts
- No baggy / tight / tapered pants
 No slits at end of pants

Shoes - Only track or canvas school shoes

Hair - Should

 Should not touch ear, eyebrows and collar
 No tinted, permed or outlandish hairstyles (No side/under-shave)
 No accessories

Ear / Neck

No jewellery
 No accessories

Collar Badge - Should be pinned on the left collar

Shirt

- No oversized / tight fitting shirts
 Must be properly tucked in and buttoned up
 Only school PE or white T-shirt can be worn
- underneath - Approved House/CCA T-
- shirts can be worn on Wednesdays and Fridays

Socks - Must be plain and visible above the shoes

Eye - No coloured contact lens

Ear - Only a pair of small earsame design allowed Neck - No jewellery

Sleeve - Should not be rolled up

Hand - No jewellery or bands - No nail polish

Skirt - Knee length

Shoes - Only track or canvas school shoes

Hair Should not touch evebrows and coll

Should Not touch eyebrows and collar
Neatly tied up once hair touches collar
No tinted, permed or outlandish hairstyles
No accessories

Collar Badge - Should be pinned on the left collar


Shirt

- No oversized / tight fitting shirts
- Only school PE or white T-shirt can be worn underneath
- Approved House/CCA Tshirts can be worn on Wednesdays and Fridays

Socks
 Must be plain and visible above the shoes,

No make-up to be worn when student is in school uniform



Keep an interested expression and don't forget to smile Remember good posture and sit up straight Don't overuse hand gestures,

> Remain calm, Don't let nerves make your feet do a tap dance

Interview Etiquette - Voice Projection •You must be heard clearly

to pronounce words in a way that makes it clear to the listener exactly what you are saying Speak Up to raise your voice a little so everyone

can hear what you have said

Well-Spoken someone who speaks clearly, concisely and in an assured fashion

Interview Etiquette - Do's and Don'ts

Do's	Don'ts	
Do prepare	Don't be late	
Do answer to the question clearly	Don't be distracted	
Do listen actively to the interviewer	Don't be impatient	
Do research about the school you are applying to	Don't give one word answer	
Do ask positive questions if given the opportunity	Don't speak negatively	
Do thank the interviewer at the end	Don't assume the interviewer can read your mind	
Group Interviews – Speak up assertively	Group Interviews – Don't hog attention
